## Title: Literacy and AAC: How to Infuse AAC in Literacy Instruction

**Course Description**: Historically, individuals with significant cognitive disabilities or complex communication needs experienced limited access to literacy instruction. There has been a push in recent years to provide all learners with comprehensive literacy instruction. Speech-language pathologists and special educators must collaborate to infuse augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) throughout daily literacy experiences. This presentation examines how to integrate AAC, core vocabulary, aided language input, and visuals within classroom instruction for learners with complex communication needs.
