Course Description

This session focuses on two major aspects of clinical service delivery for children who use AAC: how to effectively work with communication partners, and how to measure children's language development progress. First, up-to-date findings on communication partner instruction – what we know works, and what we still need to explore – will be discussed. Next, the ImPAACT Program, a step-by-step program proven to support families and educators as well as children's AAC use in naturalistic settings, will be described in detail. This discussion will include a recent adaptation that includes a telepractice component. Finally, to ensure we are helping children who use AAC meet their full potential, we must find new ways to systematically track their expressive language development. Toward this end, we will explore how a range of possible measures might be used to track various aspects of expressive language development, such as semantic vs. syntactic growth, for children who use graphic symbols (i.e., line drawings and photographs) to communicate.

Speaker Biography

Cathy Binger, Ph.D., CCC-SLP, is a professor at the University of New Mexico who specializes in AAC and has been a speech-language pathologist for over 25 years. Dr. Binger is an active researcher who develops and evaluates intervention programs designed to enhance the language skills of children who use AAC. Her work also focuses on developing partner instruction programs – that is, programs designed to teach educators and families how to communicate more effectively with children who use AAC. Dr. Binger has co-authored several books and book chapters and has published numerous research articles in both peer-reviewed journals and clinician-oriented newsletters.
