Title: Fostering Learning and Growth in Supervision Through Psychological Safety

Course Description:

Speech-language pathologists and audiologists provide supervision to a variety of individuals in the workplace including students, clinical fellows, assistants, and colleagues. Research has shown that the most critical factor in high-performing teams is psychological safety. This workshop will describe the concept of psychological safety and provide attendees with strategies to increase it in their supervisory relationships.

Define psychological safety and identify a tool for measuring it
Discuss how psychological safety affects communication and cooperation between supervisors
Implement strategies to increase psychological safety in teams.
